CREW MANAGERS INFORMATION PACK

Thank you for entering a team in the 16th Rotary Dragon Boat Challenge event. Please read all the notes below also the detailed explanations that are provided on the website under the following link https://www.rotarydragonboatchallenge.org/team-information/details/

ARRIVAL SET UP AND REGISTRATION.

Teams should arrive between 7.30am and no later than 9.00am.

- A. On arrival, your TEAM VEHICLE will be directed to your designated TEAM BASE.
- B. Your TEAM VEHICLE may deliver marquees, gazebos, BBQ's etc. to their team base, but as soon as the vehicle is unloaded it <u>must</u> return to the main parking area, and park in the reserved area for TEAM VEHICLES, making sure that the permit is clearly displayed.
- C. Each Team Captain must register on arrival with the Organisers in the Race the Dragon Events marquee adjacent to Pugneys Clubhouse, and have the completed 'Combined Crew List and Acknowledgement of Risk Form' with signatures of all the participating crew members ready to hand in.
 - The Disabled Acknowledgement of Risk Form will also be required, if applicable.
- D. On the Team Base, a small marquee/tent or gazebo may be erected. BBQ's are permissible, (gas preferred) but if charcoal burning, the BBQ MUST be raised off the ground. All teams are responsible for the safe usage of their own equipment and BBQ's.
- E. Please ensure that at the end of the day your team pitch is left in the condition you found it with all rubbish and litter removed to the provided rubbish bins around the team areas.

1. PARKING.

TO ENSURE THAT TEAM MEMBERS AND VISITORS DO NOT FALL FOUL OF LOCAL AUTHORITY PARKING ENFORCEMENT PLEASE NOTE: -

- A. Each team will be issued with one PARKING PERMIT prior to the event, which must be prominently displayed in the windscreen of your TEAM VEHICLE **AT ALL TIMES**. The permit will allow free parking, after unloading equipment at Team Bases, in the designated parking areas on the lakeside at Pugneys.
- B. To ensure availability, there will be a reserved parking area for TEAM VEHICLES, but the permit will apply in all designated parking areas. Free parking for all other vehicles attending the event will be available, and well signposted, in a field on the opposite side of Asdale Road directly opposite Pugneys.
- C. **ANY VEHICLE**, with the exception of A above, who choose to park within Pugneys, must display a valid ticket purchased from the official parking machines on site.
 - Warning. Failure to display a valid ticket, whether issued free or purchased at the ticket machines, will almost certainly result in the issue of a fixed penalty notice by the local authority warden.

2. SAFETY.

All crew managers must attend the general and safety briefing before the competition commences. All crew members must attend a safety briefing before their teams first race (even if they are not competing until a later heat) and will be issued with a wristband. No competitor will be allowed on the water unless they are wearing the wristband issued at the briefing. Safety Boats will be deployed at all times during racing.

3. SPONSORSHIP.

- A. Each team will pre-select a Charity it wishes to support.
- B. It is a condition of entry to this event that each team member raises a minimum of £50.00 personal sponsorship, with a Team target of £1000. For 2026 (as previously) 75% of the total amount of Sponsorship money collected by your team will be distributed to your Charity of choice. The balance will be distributed to Charities supported by the 2 Rotary Clubs organising the event. All money raised by sponsorship will be given to Charities, and NONE will be used for administration of the event, or any other purpose.

- C. It is also a condition of entry that ALL Sponsorship money raised by team members must be sent IN FULL, TO THE EVENT TREASURER and NOT direct to the chosen Charity. THIS IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY AND CANNOT BE VARIED. This will ensure that maximum benefit is obtained from the Gift Aid element of the Fund Raising.
- D. On receipt of your sponsorship money, and the paper Sponsorship forms where used, The Event Treasurer will, within 48 hours, return to you a cheque for 75% of your total, made out to the Charity of your choice. It is then your responsibility to hand over that cheque to your Charity.
- E. Team Captains will be expected to advise approx. value of anticipated Sponsorship for each boat at the time of Registration.

4. OBTAINING SPONSORSHIP.

There are 2 ways of raising sponsorship monies: -

A. E-Sponsorship

- A1. Once we have your team information, we will setup a PayPal campaign page for your team. This is our preferred method, used properly the benefits to you are that you can keep an eye on the amount your team members are raising and if it's not up to your expectation, increase your fund raising to benefit your charity. It also removes from you the responsibility of collecting the money after the event and allows your friends, who were not able to contribute before the event, to contribute afterwards.
- A2. Detailed instructions on how to access and use the PayPal Campaign page have been provided as a separate attachment to your confirmation of entry email.
- A3. If you would like a personalised team message on the campaign page please email Mark Allen with it (marksnydale@lineone.net).

B. Cash Sponsorship

- B1. Team members can use the sponsorship form sent with your confirmation of entry mail, along with its own set of instructions. These must be followed completely for the Gift Aid to be collected.
- **B2. PLEASE ENSURE THAT ONLY THE FORM ATTACHED TO THIS INFO PACK IS USED.**
- B3. We strongly recommend that money is collected at the time of asking to ensure it is paid.

5. RACING & RACE CONTROL AND EQUIPMENT.

- A. Racing is controlled by the PROFESSIONALS, and all decisions regarding racing, safety, suitability of competitors, etc. will be made by them and are final.
- B. Racing will commence at around 10.00am, but it will not be possible to announce any individual team start times in advance.
- C. Boats, paddles, life jackets and helmsmen will be provided by the PROFESSIONALS.

DETAILED NOTES ON ALL THE ABOVE, PLUS OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION/ADVICE IS CONTAINED IN THE APPENDIX ATTACHED. TEAM CAPTAINS ARE ENCOURAGED TO READ THEM TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE FULLY AWARE OF THE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO THE EVENT.

MOST IMPORTANTLY OF ALL --- ENJOY THE DAY!!

WHAT WE MEAN BY:-

TEAM VEHICLE. The vehicle issued with a parking permit and allowed to offload equipment at team base. Only one vehicle per team.

<u>PARKING PERMIT</u>. Issued by the Organisers in advance to be displayed in windscreens of your TEAM VEHICLE **AT ALL TIMES**, which allows free parking at Pugneys for the duration of the event.

TEAM BASE. The area allocated to each team for their gazebo, BBQ etc.

THE ORGANISERS. The Rotary Clubs of Wakefield Chantry, Normanton and Horbury & Ossett Phoenix.

THE CHARITY. We, the organisers, are the charity and are responsible for sending you a cheque made out to your charity **THE PROFESSIONALS**. Race the Dragon Ltd.


Location & Parking Address
